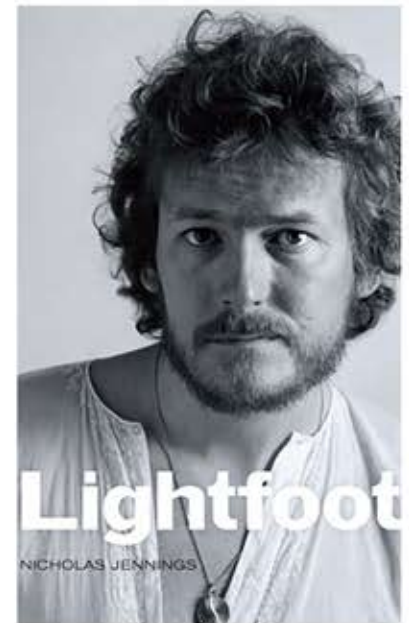

NICHOLAS JENNINGS is one of Canada's most respected music journalists. He was the critic and feature writer for *Maclean's* from 1980 to 2000 and his work has appeared in many of Canada's top magazines and newspapers. His acclaimed book *Before the Gold Rush* became the basis for a four-part CBC documentary series on the history of Canadian music.
